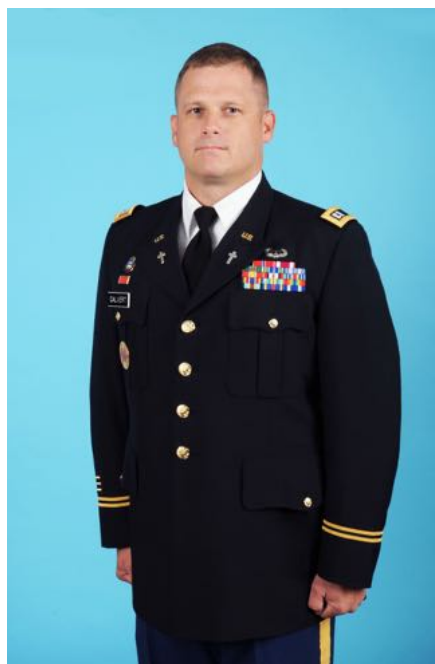


Chaplain (Captain) Andrew Evan Calvert, United States Army
